Solutions for employee housing in tourism destinations

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- 1. Introduction
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Introduction

- Not enough employees in tourism
- Housing shortage especially in the mountain regions with a lot of tourism
- Potential employees cannot find appropriate accommodation
- Housing shortage amplifies employee shortage



Possible measures

- Tourism enterprises and / or municipalities have to take action.
- SAB (national association representing Swiss mountain regions) has elaborated a guideline with various examples of solutions.
- Alpine tourism in Switzerland:
 - Strong seasonality
 - Not much state support
 - Many employees from abroad
 - High demand for employee housing





Example 1: Grimentz – Innovative tourism company

- The main tourism company of the area looked for vacant studios and small flats suitable for their employees.
- Tourism company acts as tenant → financial security for homeowners.
- Success: accommodation mobilised for more than 130 employees.









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Example 2: Davos – Housing strategy

- Municipality developed a holistic housing strategy.
- Goal: to create more accommodation for different target groups.
- Seasonally employed workers are an explicit target group.







Example 3: Unterseen – Regulation of Airbnb

- Problem, if first homes are conversed and taken away from the housing market.
- Potential accommodation for employees is suited to be offered on Airbnb.
- Measures: Minimum length of stay, proportion of first homes, bans in certain areas of the village.







Example 4: Zermatt – Obligation of hotels

- New construction of a hotel or extension of a hotel: Municipality requires that accommodation is created for additional employees.
- Rule comes into play if the new construction or extension creates more than 5 new jobs.







Example 5: Goms – Conversion of former military site

- Vacant infrastructure facilities can be turned into employee housing.
- Example: former officers' barracks.
- Possibility of renting studios to holiday guests outside of the main season.







Conclusion

- Housing for seasonally employed workers is primary the responsibility of the tourism companies.
- However, the municipalities can offer support in various ways.
- Tourism companies can join forces.
- Individual, location-specific solutions are required for each location.
